From the birth of the Indiana District in 1962, when a group of pastors set the course for what we now cherish as our district, to the present day, we stand on the shoulders of giants who laid the foundation upon which we now build. We honor their legacy, and we continue their work with a renewed sense of purpose.

We owe a great deal of gratitude to those who have sacrificed to bring us to where we are.

In just one year, God has opened new doors and provided remarkable blessings:

- We launched the Indiana Prayer Network, a powerful tool for spiritual unity and intercession.
- Bro. Carter and his team continue to streamline our financial structure, allowing for an efficient, simplistic approach.
- Through the blessings of God, we secured a \$150,000 Phase 1 grant, and a miraculous \$1.5 million Phase 2 grant for vital facility upgrades on our campgrounds.
- New leadership has emerged across the district, including a newly appointed Campground Health Officer, Nurse Practitioner, Emily Hawkins, District Promotions Director Dr. Chris Henderson, and a host of other rising leaders serving in numerous capacities, who are committed to our mission.

Now we forge ahead with our Capital Stewardship Campaign to insure we can complete the much-needed improvements to our campgrounds. This includes a beautiful new security fence and gates, new exterior lighting in our common areas, a vital natural gas connection and other infrastructure upgrades, a new children's playground, and renovations to the Workers Dorm and the Hospitality Center. Now we step forward toward revitalizing and expanding our historic tabernacle, adding over 600 new seats, and a spacious foyer with modern restrooms, and all new AVL.

Despite these blessings, we have also faced challenges. Last year, our district was dealt a shaking tragedy with the passing of Aydrian Moore during an evening service at our Indiana Junior High Youth Camp. Today, I want to take a moment to acknowledge the incredible leadership of Pastor Tony and Judy Oliver, the excellent care by their church, and the exceptional leadership of Austin Gilliland and the Indiana Youth Department, navigating such great tragedy and caring for the nearly 300 students who were deeply impacted. The strength and resilience of our district is seen in how we've navigated such difficult moments. Through it all, God has been faithful, and we have leaned on one another for support.

Now, as we look toward the future, I am excited to share a vision that is both rooted in our past and poised for the future. One year ago, we cast a vision to establish a preaching point in every county of Indiana where there is no church. I am pleased to report that, in less than one year, we have already seen progress in five of those counties, with more to come.

We won't stop until we see a 10,000-soul harvest in Indiana. This vision for souls is not just a goal; it is a calling. Together, we will press forward to see the lost saved, disciples made, and ministries launched.

We want to celebrate not only our giving but our going. I want to personally thank all of our pastors that have labored alongside missionaries in various nations around the world. My desire is to put together more Indiana Global Missions teams and send them out to help bring in the promised harvest of souls around the world. Our Global Revival is a Local Revival.

Nichols Memorial Fund is in honor of the father of our great revivalist, Pastor Todd Nichols, in New Albany, Indiana. Rev. James D. Nichols pastored in Texas and led a great revival of Cambodians in that area.

In May, our Indiana Global Missions team will be in Africa for a large Holy Ghost crusade in Awasa and Wara, Ethiopia. In July, our team will be traveling to Rwanda and Uganda for pastors training and evangelistic work.

Two weeks ago, I was in Rome, Italy. During my time there, I was led by the Spirit to a certain church. I was able to minister to a catholic priest and, upon hearing the Gospel, he received the baptism of the Holy Spirit. His desire is to be baptized in Jesus Name in the coming days.

Truly God is at work around the world!

Thank you, Indiana, for your love for souls and your sacrifice to send the Gospel around the world.

Greetings in Jesus Name,

I would like to thank the Indiana District for your support of Multicultural Ministries. This year we had a record MCM offering of \$10,000.00.

We exist to help you with resources, Bible studies, connecting with interpreters, and reaching every culture group in your city. Together – we can reach every culture group in Indiana.

Allow me to share with you the potential impact cultural groups can have upon our local congregations as we attempt to reach every culture group that God has brought into our harvest field.

According to Indiana's population statistics 378,953 or 5.6% of the states' population are immigrants. Immigrants make up 1 in 14 workers in Indiana and support the local economy in numerous ways. They account for 9.0 percent of entrepreneurs, 12.4 percent of STEM workers, and 22.6 percent of physicians in the state. As neighbors, business owners, taxpayers, and workers, immigrants are an integral part of Indiana's diverse and thriving communities and make extensive contributions that benefit all.

They represent a total of 10.1 billion dollars in spending power of which they paid 3.4 billion in taxes last year. Within this group 25.1% are from Mexico, 7.1% are from India, 4.6% are from Burma, 4.4% are from China, and 3.4% are from the Philippines.

Just within the Indy Metro area there are people from seventy-two different nations of the world. Truly God has brought the mission field to our back yard. Last May, I received a phone call from a Burmese group that received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost and were kicked out of the Baptist church they were attending. I invited them to attend our church service the next Sunday night. During the service, three of their elders received the Holy Ghost. I started collaborating with them and allowed them to use our "Church In A Day" building to have church services. Last July I had the honor of baptizing their pastor in Jesus Name. We now have the only Apostolic church in the world that speaks the Matu language.

Multicultural Ministries has several resources available to help you "see" the harvest, "find" the harvest, and "reap" the harvest that God has brought to every small town and large city in Indiana.

One resource is GlobalTracks.com which has a vast database of doctrinal books, Bible studies, and teaching materials in multiple languages that are available to download for free to use as a tool for evangelism and discipleship.

October 18, 2026, is All Nations Sunday for the entire UPCI. AllNationsSunday.com is full of resources and planning material to help you plan a successful evangelistic weekend and celebrate the diversity within your community. I encourage you to receive an offering for MCM on All Nations Sunday to help support the Multicultural Ministries of the UPCI.

If I can serve you in any way or help connect you to various cultures or refugees in your community, please reach out as we are here to assist you in this great evangelistic opportunity.

Dear Fellow Ministers,

The Mission

It is with great joy and deep conviction that we witness the continual growth of the Indiana North American Missions Department. We had a record number of attendance of well over 1000, 28 were filled with the Holy Ghost and 8 were baptized in the precious name of Jesus. We have continued to receive reports of Pastors who came weary and worn out, returned home with a fresh vision to continue to do the work God has called them to do.

Since camp, Bro. Felipe Pagan has opened a new daughter work in Pendleton, Indiana. Also, Bro. Samuel Castelan and family moved to Bloomington, Indiana to continue the work of the church plant started by Bro. Gary Landaw. We are thankful for those who have answered the call to continue to expand His Kingdom.

In order to expand the Kingdom, we also need to be prepared. We are thankful for the opportunity to partner with *IBC en Español* to invest in future leaders and ministers. In May we had 34 students graduate and we currently have 32 enrolled. We have students enrolled from Indiana as well as multiple states and other countries. This year our focus for our Zone events will also be on training in order to continue to prepare leaders for the harvest.

At the beginning of the year, we were able to give \$5,000 from the Spanish Ministries account to the Camp Asphalt Project. Also, multiple Spanish churches gave sacrificially to this project in April. This year our Spanish Ladies joined with Indiana Ladies Ministries and we had a record number of Spanish churches give to Mothers Memorial. We look forward to a record year of giving in Spanish Ministries.

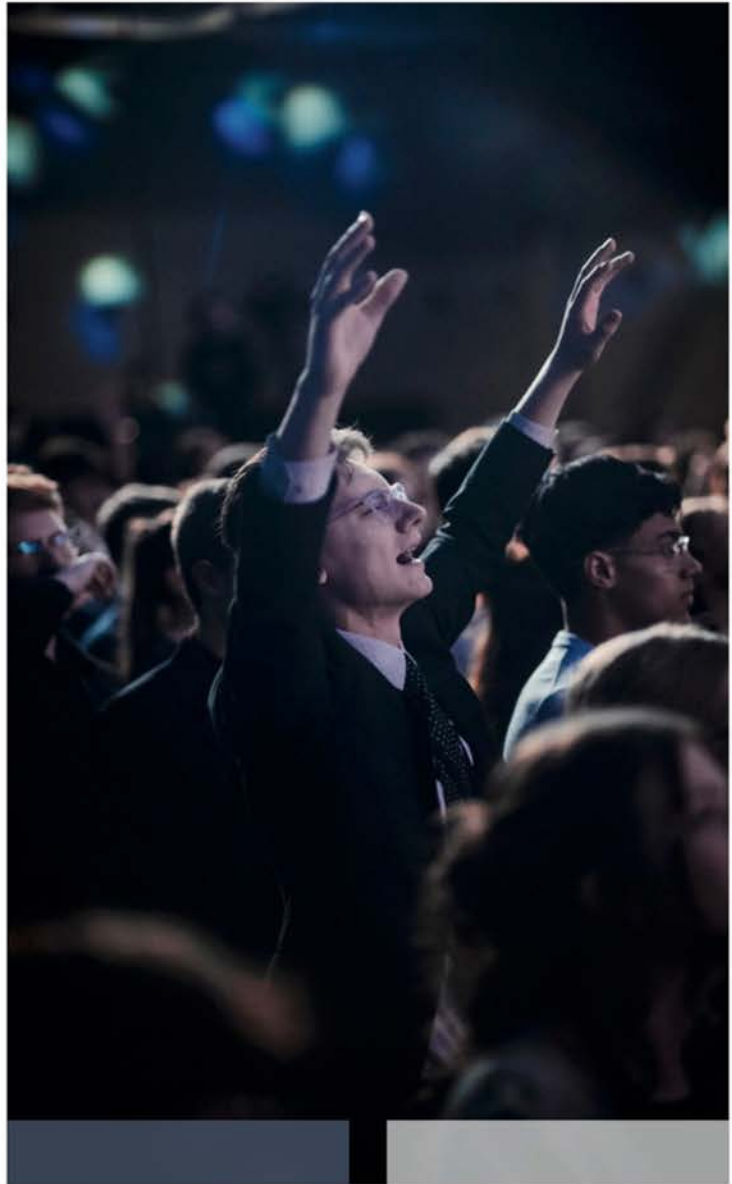

Notes to Financial Statements

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Summary of Operations

The Indiana District United Pentecostal Church, Inc. is organized as a local affiliate of the United Pentecostal Church International, headquarters, Weldon Springs, MO. It operates as a 501 (c) 3 organization, Group Exemption# 1411. It operates as a volunteer, non-profit organization and is dedicated to serving the spiritual and religious needs of its members.

Significant Accounting Policies

- (a) *Basis of Accounting* – The Church maintains accounting records and prepares its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than generally accepted United States accounting principles. However, it is a widely accepted method for churches.
- (b) *Basis of Presentation* – Financial Statement presentation follows the recommendation of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Accounting Standards (SFAS) No 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*. Under SFAS No 117, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities, according to three classes of net assets, temporarily restricted assets, and permanently restricted net assets.
- (c) *Fair Value of Financial Instruments* – Unless otherwise indicated, the Fair Value of all reported assets and liabilities which represent financial instruments (none of which are held for trading purposes), approximates the carrying value of such amounts.
- (d) *Donated Goods and Services* – An appreciable number of volunteers have donated significant amount of their time, labor, and expertise. Volunteer services neither create nor enhance non-financial assets nor do they require specialized skills, and thus are not recognized as support in the accompanying statement of activities. All non-cash donated goods and services that meet the criteria for recognition are reflected at their estimated fair market values at the date of receipt.

- (e) **Contributions** – All contributions are considered available for unrestricted use, unless specifically restricted by the donor. All contributions are for charitable, religious benefit only and the donor receives no additional material benefits.
- (f) **Income Taxes** – The District is a not-for-profit organization and claims exemption from Federal and State income taxes under Internal Revenue Code 501 (c) 3 and similar provisions of state income tax law based on the Group Exemption #1411 of the United Pentecostal Church, Intl.
- (g) **Real Estate Taxes** – The District maintains tax exempt status with the Local County Authorities and files annual exemption forms on all property to be exempted from paying local property tax.
- (h) **Fixed Assets** – The District maintains no formal fixed assets records prior to 2010; Costs of the Building, Land, and Parsonage was estimated to reasonable value. Estimates were done for equipment, furniture, sound system, and/or fixtures. Accordingly, since 2010 the Fixed Assets as noted on the Statement of Financial Position are recorded at market value as best determined by market computations. After 2010, new items are listed at cost.

NOTE 2: RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

As of December 31, 2025, the Church has \$0.00 in temporarily restricted net assets.

NOTE 3: CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and Cash equivalents include all money in bank and highly liquid investments with maturity dates of less than twelve months.

The balance in banking accounts and other short-term investments is \$2,941,464.58 as of December 31, 2025. All funds in banking institutions may or may not be covered by insurance provided by the Federal Government (FDIC). However, all investments are deemed to be secure because of the type of investment and the institution with which the investment is made. Management feels adequately secure with all investments presently in its portfolio.

We are noting that there are differences in the beginning balances as of January 1st, 2025, due to the fact the administration has reallocated the amounts to different categories. The reallocation does not materially affect the outcome of the balances.
